This was the first time since our inception that we offered a full-day program, and our staff quickly adapted to meet the needs of our members. In addition to supporting students throughout their distance learning day, we made it a priority to deliver enriching hands-on activities and interactive experiences to respond to the learning losses that students are facing in this virtual landscape.

"The structured environment the Club provides – between scheduled pickups, routine cleaning, open communication – I felt very safe sending my son to the Club and he wanted to be there. He was bored on his own and I felt terrible that I couldn't give him all the attention he deserved because of my work," said Amanda, whose son attends the Club's full-day program. Amanda described the Club as a 'saving grace' for their family and she is relieved that her son was able to experience a sense of normalcy.

While 2020 was been a trying year, we are so appreciative of our community for continuing to help our families. We worked with our partners and donors to collect new and gently used winter items for our members during the fall months to distribute once the winter weather arrived. Because of the donations received, we were able to host a Winter Drive and provide more than 20 families with clothing to keep them warm all winter.
