ANAWANS & ROVERS:

Campers between the ages of 6-8 will automatically be grouped into one of these categories; ages 6-7 Anawans, age 8 Rovers. They will get a chance to visit all age-appropriate activities throughout the two-week session.

Campers age 9+

TRADITIONAL ROAMERS:

For our 9+ campers who are ready to explore Camp independently and choose their own activities throughout the day. They will check in with their assigned counselor periodically.

THE EXPLORERS:

For our campers who are 9+ and would benefit from being with an assigned group and have a set schedule each day. Explorers will have the opportunity to visit all that Camp Ramsbottom has to offer during their 2-week session.

Camp Provides:

Transportation, athletic and craft supplies. Water bottle filling stations are also available throughout Camp.

What to Bring to Camp:

Towel, bathing suit, hat, sunscreen, lunch, water bottle (filling stations available throughout Camp), appropriate footwear (no flip-flops), and insect repellent. Inclement weather programming provided, but campers must bring rain gear. Please write camper's name on all personal items.

Lunches:

Lunches may be purchased in advance for a fee of \$40 per session upon registration.

Please Do Not Bring:

Cell phones (campers who need to call a parent/guardian should go to the Office), hand-held electronics/games, toys, collectible cards, sports equipment, and animals. Additionally, weapons, drugs or alcohol of any kind are prohibited.

Trading Post:

The Trading Post offers snacks and beverages for purchase throughout the day. Water bottle filling stations are also available throughout the Camp. All campers will have the option to visit the Trading Post daily.

Wednesday Campfires:

Each week, one group will be invited for a Campfire and cook-out program. This privilege is on an invitation only basis and is used to honor those campers who have shown exemplary Camp spirit. To be eligible the child must be enrolled during the session in which the Campfire for that group is scheduled. A small additional fee is required for attendance at the Campfire.

General Health Guidelines:

- Wellness Checks: Every day prior to entering Camp, every member and staff should undergo a wellness check at home to ensure that no symptoms of COVID-19 or any other transmissible illness are present and the individual has not been recently exposed.
- Handwashing & Sanitizing: Campers and staff will be encouraged to wash and sanitize their hands frequently throughout the day.
- COVID-19 Testing: We encourage all campers and staff to get tested for COVID-19 regularly while attending Camp.

*Subject to change based on Massachusetts Department of Public Health regulations at the time of Camp.

Camp Ramsbottom complies with regulations of the Massachusetts Department of Public Health regulations and is licensed by Town of Rehoboth Board of Health. Camp Ramsbottom is ACA accredited.

Extended Care:

- 7:30 a.m.-5:30 p.m. (in Rehoboth or Boys & Girls Club of Pawtucket)
- \$100 additional per two-week session
- Space is limited!

Scholarships/Financial Assistance:

Families meeting established income guidelines are eligible for one free session for each child who attends Camp Ramsbottom. As a Rhode Island based organization, the majority of scholarship funds are available to Pawtucket and Rhode Island residents, but a small number of scholarships for Massachusetts families are also available. Those applying for scholarships must fill out a separate form, pay a \$25 application fee, and provide proof of income and residency. All campers attending must have a current Boys & Girls Club of Pawtucket membership. Availability is limited. Rhode Island DHS are accepted. DHS families are responsible for the difference between their authorized rate and the Camp fee.

Arrival and Dismissal from Camp:

- Drop-off campers between 8:15 and 8:45 a.m. (To avoid the congestion caused by Camp buses)
- Campers arriving late must sign in at the office with an accompanying adult.
- Pick-up time is between 4:15 and 4:45 p.m. (This will allow buses to leave Camp at 4:00 p.m.)
- Parents/guardians requesting early dismissal must send a note to the Camp office. A phone call follow-up is also recommended.
- We recommend that early dismissals be scheduled between 12:30 and 1:30 p.m. However, the early pick-up time must be before 3:00 p.m.

Transportation:

Bus stops are conveniently located throughout nearby Rhode Island and Southeastern Massachusetts (See next page for bus stop locations). Bus pick-ups start at 8:15 a.m. Camp Ramsbottom will provide supervision on every bus but NOT at every bus stop. Parents/Guardians are expected to supervise their children until they board the bus and must be at the bus stop when they return from Camp at 4:15 p.m. Campers must arrive and return home on the same bus. Campers must also arrive and depart from Camp by the same transportation method. Please note: departure and arrival times may vary depending on stop location and traffic conditions.

Camp Fees:

- \$525 per two-week session (Lunch available for an additional fee of \$40 per session.)
- A Boys & Girls Club of Pawtucket membership is also required.
 Membership fee for Pawtucket and Central Falls residents is \$50;
 for all other locations, annual fee is \$70.
- Refund (minus deposits) granted only if Camp office is notified in writing 14 days before session starts. Requests can be emailed to ramsbottom@bgcpawt.org

(All refunds will be handled on a discretionary basis by Camp Management.)

- A \$75 non-refundable & non-transferable deposit is required per session.
- Balances are due two weeks prior to the start of the season.
- Registrations for Camp sessions will not be accepted until back balances on any and all Club programs have been paid.

Steps to Register:

- 1) Complete the Boys & Girls Club of Pawtucket online membership
- 2) Complete the online Camp Ramsbottom registration
- 3) Create a PlayerSpace log in using the link automatically sent to you after completing your Camp registration
- **4)** Add your child's Emergency Contacts/Authorized Pick Ups to your PlayerSpace account
- 5) Complete the PlayerSpace Health History questions
- 6) Upload a copy of your child's physical examination conducted during the preceding 18 months that is signed by a licensed healthcare provider to your PlayerSpace account
- 7) Upload your child's current immunization record signed by a licensed healthcare provider to your PlayerSpace account
- 8) If child requires medication at Camp, complete a separate Authorization to Administer Mecication form found on your PlayerSpace account

For children who require accommodations for accessibility and/or additional physical, emotional, mental, or social needs, please speak directly with our Camp Director prior to registration, to determine our ability to meet your child's needs.
