
WHO WE DO IT FOR



THE KIDS AT OUR CLUB

What kids do when they aren't in school matters, as only 27% of their day is spent in school. This year, the Club welcomed an average of 172 members (ages 5-18) after school each and every day – making sure they had the time they needed to learn, develop meaningful friendships, and explore new interests in a safe and fun environment.

In the 2023 fiscal year, 95% of our Out-of-School Time Club members were residents of Pawtucket or Central Falls, two communities that are currently impacted with high levels of financial insecurity. At the Club, there are no barriers for kids to have access to quality afterschool programs. 95% of our members feel that the Club accepts them for who they are.





THE KIDS AT CAMP RAMSBOTTOM

Since 1967, the Boys & Girls Club of Pawtucket has been operating Camp George R. Ramsbottom, a cherished summer haven for youth ages 6-13, offering a wide range of enriching activities across 170+ acres of land for our kids to explore. 100% of camper parents agreed that our Camp activities are fun, engaging, and age appropriate.


We welcomed **1,667 campers this year**, expanding our reach by serving youth from **72** different zip codes across Northern Rhode Island and Southeastern Massachusetts. The Boys & Girls Club of Pawtucket is committed to equity and accessibility, and to support this, we offer camp scholarships and free transportation. With help from several partners and individuals, our **Club was able to provide 158 full Camp scholarships** to low-to-median income families – helping create brighter summers filled with unique opportunities.












REVENUES FISCAL YEAR 2023:





OUR VISION FOR...

ACADEMIC SUCCESS

In Pawtucket, the need for academic support is greater than ever, with only 7% of Pawtucket eighth graders meeting grade-level math expectations and 17% meeting reading expectations. At the Club, each afternoon begins with a "power hour" of homework completion, followed by tutoring, access to our technology labs, and an abundance of high-yield learning activity choices. This year, 91% OF OUR MEMBERS SAID THEY ENJOYED LEARNING NEW THINGS HERE AT THE CLUB.

The Club surveys members to ensure our educational programs fit their needs and interests. Last year, nearly half of our pre-teen members said STEM Club was their favorite activity. With support from our partners, 170 MEMBERS PARTICIPATED IN STEM ACTIVITIES including hands-on science experiments, coding, computer literacy, and more.

PARTNER SHOUT OUT: BOSTON SCIENTIFIC

Boston Scientific has boosted our STEM Club initiatives, enabling our youth to explore podcasting, digital editing, and 3D printing. Their support equips our members with vital skills and ignites a love for science and technology, empowering the next generation of geniuses.











CONFIDENT SELF-EXPRESSION THROUGH THE ARTS

Every day, we provide our members with access to creative outlets across media, such as hands-on visual arts, music, creative writing, and performing arts. Our art classes apply a therapeutic approach, helping youth regulate their emotions through art and express themselves. This year, 40 KIDS PARTICIPATED IN OUR CLUB TALENT SHOW singing, dancing, and most importantly – cheering on their friends with infectious encouragement.

PARTNER SHOUT OUT: GAMM THEATRE

With help from the Gamm Theatre, our members have mentors and receive regular drama and stage performance programming throughout the year. With their continued support, our members will not only be prepared for another successful talent show in 2024, but also receive the creative support they need at the Club and beyond.

GOOD CHARACTER & CITIZENSHIP

We provide our members with a safe space to discover themselves and their values – as well as programs that encourage them to participate in volunteer service and build upon their cultural awareness and positive community involvement. 98% OF CLUB MEMBERS ARE CONFIDENT THAT IF THEY TRY THEIR BEST, THEY CAN DO ANYTHING - an example of the positive attitudes we nurture at the Club.


This year, we had a total of 34 members participate and graduate from Members to Moguls, our workforce development program, with 100% SURVEYING THAT THE PROGRAM SET THEM UP FOR THE PROFESSIONAL WORLD. Not only that, we launched a paid internship program – providing hands-on application of the skills they learned in a business setting.

PARTNER SHOUT OUT: MENTOR RI

Thanks to MENTOR RI, we have built a strong network of quality adult role-models who helped our youth thrive at home, school, and in career development. Through helping us match mentees with encouraging mentors, our youth were able to build trust, healthy adult relationships, and share experiences that will lay the groundwork for happy and successful lives.











HEALTHY LIFESTYLES

We're committed to nurturing holistic well-being among our youth. Each day, members are provided a free healthy meal, followed by many healthy activity choices, social-emotional learning, and more.

Our members' commitment to making healthy choices is exceptional, with 100% OF OUR MEMBERS REPORTING THEY AVOID RISKY BEHAVIORS, SUCH AS SUBSTANCE USE, reflects how we've supported their needs and provide them with better choices.

This year, our efforts have shown significant progress with a 20% increase in members engaging in physical activity for more than 60 minutes, five or more days a week. Not to mention the increased participation in team sports, with a total of 332 members in our summer RBI/Jr. RBI baseball league.

PARTNER SHOUT OUT: RI FOOD BANK - KIDS CAFE

Through RI Food Bank's Kids Café, a program of Feeding America, we assure every youth member has a nutritious evening meal – and that's not all! Their chefs and nutrition experts develop the menu with our kids in mind – incorporating fresh, healthy, and culturally relevant meals based off member feedback. Thanks to our partnership with RI Food Bank, we are promising delicious meals that support healthy youth development and bring smiles to their faces!



BGCP & SLATER MIDDLE SCHOOL GET RI READY

On March 28, 2023 the Rhode Island Department of Education awarded \$4 million to support Governor McKee's RI Ready initiative. This initiative is aimed to enhance educational programs through expanding access and extending learning opportunities for students throughout the state.

The Boys & Girls Club of Pawtucket was one of the 21 grant recipients, partnering with Slater Middle School through a collaborative program that will take place onsite at Slater Middle School once their school day concludes, as well as onsite at our Clubhouse. This program focuses on creating fun hands-on learning experiences and enrichment opportunities to support students' academic, social-emotional, and extracurricular needs.

To support the year-round needs for learning and engagement, the Boys & Girls Club of Pawtucket kick-started the program this past summer, and it's off to a strong start. Our Teen Summer Program saw 24 new Slater student members, all who attended the program free of cost to them and their families – promising no kid is left behind. We are expecting to see even higher numbers when school starts in the fall.

And that's not all - thanks to support of the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), the Club was able to aquire two brand new 14-passenger busses - expanding transportation options and ensuring safe travel to all the students who benefit from our after-school and summer programs.











OPENING DOORS WITH OUR COMMUNITY - FOR OUR COMMUNITY

With an outstanding response from our annual Opening Doors celebration being held at Camp Ramsbottom last year, we were happy to hold our 11th Annual Opening Doors there again this year. The event had the best turnout to date, with over 250 attendees and a record breaking amount in sponsorships and ticket sales, raising over \$90,000 in funds that helped us to continue to open doors and opportunities for our youth.

Attendees were able to enjoy the beautiful weather while taking hayride tours across the 170+ acres of our campgrounds. We provided all guests with local beverages and their choice of food from some of our favorite food trucks. We are grateful to have had the support from our donors, sponsors, and loyal friends of the Club, including Navigant as the event's Presenting Sponsor. Guests also had the opportunity to hear from Club and Camp families and learn about how our organization has impacted their lives.
