



CAMP RAMSBOTTOM -BACK FOR ANOTHER FUN FILLED SUMMER!

How do we get through the long, cold winter? Dreaming about summer of course! And here at the Club, summer means the start of Camp Ramsbottom registration for summer 2024 opens on March 1. Located in Rehoboth, MA, Camp Ramsbottom features 171 acres of summertime fun. Summer programs at Camp are offered to youth ages 6-13, and runs from June through August in four two-week sessions. Children can spend the entire summer with us, or select a specific session.



Camp Ramsbottom has everything your child could want in a fun summer camp, including: an adventure course, archery, arts & crafts, basketball, drama, fishing, hiking, mini-golf, bunnies and goats, soccer, swimming, tennis, pickleball, and much more, all led by caring and professional staff.

Campers ages 6 through 8 are assigned a group to be with all day they will be able to go to all age appropriate activities within their 2week session. For campers ages 9-13, they have the option to either Camp independently. checking in with their assigned counselor periodically throughout the day, or be assigned to a group of other children their age.
